Nationally the population is aging. Iowa's elder population is no different and is predicted to continue rising. Released on August 1, 2024, from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) was the fiscal year 2025 Medicare Hospital Inpatient Prospective Payment System (IPPS) final rule, which includes an Age Friendly Structural Measure. The goal for the measure is to ensure older adults receive age friendly care using evidence-based resources that align with what the patient and their family/caregivers want.
